

## Resolution Approved By the Council No. 7115 LULAC of Naples.

On May 19, 2007, Council No. 7115 LULAC of Naples met with all of its members present. LULAC's member, Victor A. Valdés, presented a resolution named "Free America of the Police Violence Cultures." The resolution was supported by LULAC's member Rodolfo Pumariega, and submitted to vote by the membership, passing unanimously. The resolution reads:

## Resolution to Free America of the Police Violence Culture

Whereas, it is a documental fact that the news media tells us almost daily of police violence culture.

Whereas, it is a well documented fact that incidence of Civil Rights violations are in an increase in the United States.

Whereas, it is well known that LULAC is the Nation's oldest and largest Latino Organization in the United States advocating for the Civil Rights of Hispanics and other Minorities.

Therefore, by the present resolution we ask to LULAC State Florida Convention 2007, to establish a commission in Civil Rights to work with LULAC state hoard, the community and the law agencies to eliminate the excessive use of force when interacting with the community.
